### Personal Reflections on Buenos Aires and the WFCCN Ged Williams, Associate Editor

Let me be bold and make the following statement: the 2nd Congress of the World Federation of Critical Care Nurses (WFCCN), held in Buenos Aires in August 2005 was the most significant and historical event in the world of critical care nursing to date! The conference was a combined event, which included the World Congresses of the World Federation of Societies of Intensive and Critical Care Medicine (WFSICCM) and the World Federation of Pediatric and Intensive and Critical Care Societies (WFPICCS). I feel very privileged to have been one of 4500 delegates who participated in the events. Some of the main highlights were:

- The first ever Joint World Congress of WFSICCM, WFCCN and WFPICCS
- Launch of the WFCCN Declaration of Buenos Aires: Position statement 2 on the provision of critical care workforce.
- Launch of the WFCCN Declaration of Madrid: Position statement on the provision of critical care nursing education
- Launch of the first WFCCN report 2001-2005
- The inaugural Joint council meeting of the WFSICCM and WFCCN
- and a commitment to ongoing regular meetings and shared activity. The inaugural meeting of South American critical care nursing leaders 6. hosted by WFCCN at which a commitment, plan and time frame was established to form the Pan American Federation of Critical Care Nurses in 2006.
- Agreement by WFCCN to hold its 4th World Congress in South Africa in 2007. It is anticipated that a forum of African Critical Care Nursing leaders will meet at this event and draw up a plan and time frame for an African Federation of Critical Care Nurses before the end of the cur
- Election of a new WFCCN leadership team and confirmation that 8. WFCCN now has 27 member countries

The challenges for the WFCCN remain enormous: the establishment of critical care nursing associations in countries where such professional support is absent, provision of quality education programs, influencing governments' policies on the provision of critical care services, world-wide distribution of resources, poverty, HIV/AIDS, natural disasters and the threat of war and terrorism. All these, and more, challenge individual critical care nurses on a daily basis. The WFCCN and its member associations have an important role to provide leadership, advice and direction on how these issues may be tackled locally, nationally and globally.

On a personal note I wish to record my sincere thanks to the many people and organisations that have helped me, and the WFCCN, achieve what we have so far. Individually I would have to thank hundreds of wonderful people - many of them know who they are. On this occasion however I will identify significant organisations and their leaders in particular:

- Code Blue Nursing Agency and their Director Mr Rod Hancock, who shared our vision and enthusiasm from the start.
- The WFSICCM, especially Dr Philip Lumb (outgoing president) and Dr Jose Besso (incoming president).
- The International Council of Nurses and in particular Judith Oulton, CEO of ICN and a great support to me personally.
- The Australian College of Critical Care Nurses who, like those already mentioned, shared the vision and passion and provided practical financial support to ensure I could get to the many strategically important meetings I needed to.
- Finally and most importantly I must sincerely thank my wife Tracey and our four children for their patience, tolerance and love - my
